

### Another ANSER-ARES Success: 5<sup>th</sup> Annual Conference

### Grand succès de la 5ème conférence ANSER-ARES !




Over 100 delegates attended the ANSER-ARES Conference held on the campuses of the University of Waterloo and Sir Wilfred Laurier University. Concurrent workshops were dynamic and of high caliber. Although we can't list all of the sessions here, a snapshot of some of the papers presented includes: impact investing - investments that create positive social, environmental and economic impact while generating financial return (Barbosa-Vargas, Hossain & Mendell); a report on exploratory research seeking to identify key themes and methods of Latin American Community Economic Development (CED) and social economy experiences (Brohman & Mozos); nonprofit communication studies (Grosenick); an exploration of the nature and extent of board conflict and a proposal for understanding board design (Ihrke, MacDonald, Duffy & Grasse), and a paper discussing issues related to poverty and food security (Survery). Also on the ANSER-ARES website are the two presentations by the Conference Keynote speakers, Allyson Hewitt, who spoke about MaRS and social innovation,

and Frances Westley, who discussed efforts to finding innovating solutions to the linked, intractable social and ecological problems we face as a society. Both of these presentations were enthusiastically received. Needless to say, discussions of governance, citizen engagement, the social economy and many other issues could be heard throughout the conference.

In addition, ANSER hosted a lively plenary session on May 31<sup>st</sup> involving the president of SSHRC, Chad Gaffield, and Budd Hall, UNESCO Chair of Community Based Research and Social Responsibility in Higher Education, University of Victoria, on Campus-Community Research Collaboration: New Approaches for the 21st Century.

Planning is underway for next year's ANSER-ARES conference, which will take place in British Columbia, at the University of Victoria. We will keep you updated as plans unfold.



**2012 Distinguished Service Award Winner / Prix honoraire : Yves Vaillancourt**



Professor Vaillancourt came to Waterloo with his wife to receive the distinguished service award at Thursday's May 31st ANSER Banquet. He has been a member of the Association since its inception and is an active retiree from the School of Social Work of the Université du Québec in Montreal where he specialized in the area of social policy and wrote extensively about Canadian social policy, federal-provincial relations, home care services, social housing and services for elderly and disabled persons. He was a member of CURA (Community-University Research Alliances) and continues his work with CRISES, a research centre working on social innovations in social economy, enterprises and trade unions, and with GESQ, Groupe d'économie solidaire du Québec. Professor Vaillancourt remains an engaged researcher in Québec, across Canada and internationally and writes in French, English and Spanish.

In his acceptance speech for the Distinguished Service Award, Professor Vaillancourt referred to the work of several aspects of civil society in promoting the development of a sound socioeconomic model that respects the environment and the principles of the social economy. Le Professeur Vaillancourt était à Waterloo avec son épouse pour recevoir un prix honoraire lors du Banquet d'ANSER le 31 mai dernier. Membre de notre Association depuis sa création, Yves Vaillancourt est un retraité actif de l'École de travail social de l'Université du Québec à Montréal où il a fait carrière dans le domaine des politiques sociales et a écrit abondamment sur la politique sociale au Canada, les relations fédérales-provinciales, les services à domicile, le logement social et les services aux personnes âgées et aux personnes handicapées. Il a été membre de l'ARUC (Alliance de recherche Universités-Communautés) en économie sociale et est toujours actif au CRISES, un centre de recherche interuniversitaire sur les innovations sociales, ainsi qu'au GESQ, le Groupe d'économie solidaire du Québec. Il poursuit son travail de chercheur engagé au Québec, au Canada et à l'international, et continue de publier en français, en anglais et en espagnol.

Dans son bref message comme récipiendaire du prix ANSER, le Professeur Vaillancourt a abordé le rôle de plusieurs segments de la société civile dans la promotion d'un modèle de développement socioéconomique respectueux de l'environnement et des principes de l'économie sociale.
